Tier 2: Descriptive Type (50 Marks)

Tier 2 is a descriptive paper designed to test candidates' writing and comprehension skills. The duration is 1 hour.

1. Essay Writing (30 Marks)

- Candidates are required to write an essay on a given topic.
- Topics may include:
 - o Current Affairs (e.g., National Security, Cybercrime, Terrorism)
 - o Socio-Economic Issues
 - o Environmental Challenges
 - Science and Technology
 - o Government Policies and Initiatives
- Word Limit: Approximately 300-400 words
- Focus Areas: Clarity of thought, coherence, structure, and relevance to the topic

2. English Comprehension & Precis Writing (20 Marks)

- Reading Comprehension: Answer questions based on a given passage.
- Precis Writing: Summarize a given passage in your own words (usually one-third of the original length).
- Focus Areas: Understanding, summarizing skills, and language proficiency.

Interview (100 Marks)

- Candidates who qualify in Tier 1 and Tier 2 are called for the interview.
- The interview assesses:
 - o General Knowledge and Awareness
 - o Analytical Ability
 - o Personality and Communication Skills
 - o Motivation for joining the Intelligence Bureau
 - o Knowledge of Current Affairs and Security Issues
- Candidates may be asked about their educational background, work experience (if any), and situational questions related to intelligence and security.

Preparation Tips

- **General Awareness**: Stay updated with current affairs through newspapers, magazines, and reliable online sources.
- Quantitative Aptitude: Practice numerical problems and focus on speed and accuracy.
- **Reasoning**: Solve puzzles and practice logical reasoning questions regularly.
- **English Language**: Improve vocabulary, grammar, and comprehension skills through reading and practice.
- **Descriptive Paper**: Practice essay and precis writing to improve articulation and time management.
- **Mock Tests**: Take regular mock tests to simulate exam conditions and improve time management.
- **Interview**: Prepare for questions on current affairs, national security, and personal background.
